



Giving Students Access to Sonocent Software on the Day of Their Assessment

Your Questions Answered

Overview

From April 2017, students can access an extended, 60-day trial version of Sonocent Audio Notetaker - immediately after their DSA assessment.

Why are we doing this?

Following conversations with DSA professionals, it's clear that students sometimes have a frustrating wait before receiving their recommended software. So we've decided to help them access the benefits of Sonocent on the very day they see an assessor.

How do students access the trial version?

In early April, we'll send all assessment centres a PDF to email students at the end of their DSA assessment.

This will point students towards a web page where they can download the 60-day trial:
www.sonocent.com/60-day-trial

Upon downloading the software, students will also receive:

- Access to Sonocent training videos
- Access to the Sonocent Link mobile app
- Information on what to do when they receive their DSA equipment

Does the trial version come with all the features of the software?

Yes. So even before they receive their full licence, students can build a library of richly-informative Projects to draw upon for revision and assignments.

Will students also have immediate access to the Sonocent Link mobile app?

Yes. Once they've registered their 60-day trial version of Audio Notetaker, they can download and activate Sonocent Link on any iOS or Android device. The welcome pack that we'll send to all students via email will explain this.

Can a student access the Sonocent Link app without registering their trial copy of Sonocent Audio Notetaker?

No. To activate Sonocent Link they will need the email address and last four digits of the Licence Key that they used to activate Audio Notetaker.

How it Works...

1

At the end of their assessment, the DSA assessor gives/emails the student a leaflet that includes:

- reminders of the ways in which Sonocent can support them in their learning
- a link (www.sonocent.com/60-day-trial) where they can download a special 60-day trial copy of the software.



2

The student heads to www.sonocent.com/60-day-trial and enters their name and email address. This will generate:

- a Licence Key
- a link to download the 60-day trial
- a link to our student welcome pack which outlines how to get set up with the software and app, and what to do when they get their DSA software licence.

Students will receive a follow-up email with their account details and links to training materials.

Before the 60-day trial period ends, students will receive a 'catch-up' email reminding them what to do when they get their DSA software licence.

When the student receives their software through the DSA, they need simply enter their new, perpetual licence key and carry on working with the Projects they've created so far.
